PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents,

2016 has been another very rewarding year at Birrong Girls High School. Our achievements, strong learning culture and talented teaching staff were acknowledged in an external validation conducted during November. All public schools in NSW are required to undergo an external validation every five years. The external validation was led by two school principals who measured the school's progress against a school excellence framework. We are delighted with the findings of the validation which indicate that our school is performing at a very high standard, excelling in most of the elements of teaching and learning and sustaining and growing in the domain of leading.

Yearly reports reflect these achievements and will be distributed to Years 7–10 during Week 10 of this term. Reports include comments from teachers which indicate strengths and areas targeted for improvement. Students should consider their reports carefully and heed their teachers' advice to help overcome any issues experienced with their school work. It is also important that students reflect on the 'Application to Learning' section of the report. It indicates the extent to which a student works to the best of her ability and applies herself to the demands of her subjects. All students should be achieving 'always' in this section.

I encourage all parents to read their daughter's report carefully, discuss teachers' comments with their daughter and acknowledge and praise excellent achievement and offer encouragement for improvement.

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Congratulations to **Ms Trish Winchcombe** who was recognised for her outstanding leadership in the creative and performing arts, as well as her commitment to school improvement and initiatives fostering community partnerships at the Principals' Celebration event on 27 October.

We will meet our Year 7 students for 2017 at their Orientation Day on Tuesday 6 December. Demand for enrolments has been extraordinarily high; as a result, enrolments for Year 7 for 2017 are now closed. Many families in the local community have heard about the high quality teaching and learning that happens at Birrong and want their daughters to be a part of our success. Maggie Hamilton, a leading authority on the challenges experienced by girls in today's world, will present a workshop on Orientation Day. Maggie will provide parents with an insight into the teenage world as well as discuss ideas to support our new Year 7 parents in coping with the adolescent years.

On Wednesday 14 December the school community will celebrate the outstanding academic, sporting and extra-curricular achievements of the girls at our Presentation Day at the Bankstown Sports Club from 12:00pm. Parents and friends are warmly invited to participate in this important recognition ceremony.

The Year 12 class of 2016 applied themselves to their studies with diligence and sustained effort and deserve to do well. I look forward to receiving notification of their **HSC results on Thursday**15 **December.** Many will achieve very high Australian Tertiary Admission Ranks (ATAR) and pursue further study at university or TAFE, while others will enter the workforce. Regardless of their results and ATAR scores, the values of personal excellence, respect, responsibility, cooperation, integrity, understanding, tolerance and inclusion, integral to this school and public education, will serve them well. They leave this

school well prepared for lifelong learning with skills and knowledge to take their place as active, productive and responsible citizens in our society. They can be proud to have been students of Birrong Girls High School.

We had two guests named Reece and Hannah who taught us the rules about wheelchair basketball. They also told us of their struggle to overcome the restrictions of their disability in order to play sport. Reece and Hannah sustained their disability differently. While Hannah was born with her disability, Reece's disability was self-inflicted due to a road accident. He talked about the dangers of speeding, the risks of driving recklessly and how the outcome can dramatically change your life. He reminded us that we are not immortal and that for every impulsive decision there are severe consequences.

We all had an opportunity to experience playing wheelchair basketball and found it a very enjoyable, yet challenging sport. This allowed us to empathise with the people that are disabled, whilst also learning about the modifications made to suit the needs of this specific group. Not only was this incursion a great opportunity for practical learning, but as each guest spoke, we all listened attentively and were all inspired by both Reece and Hannah's braveness, resilience and ability to accept the struggles of life. This allowed all of our peers to feel a sense of empathy and empower us to face life with an open mind. We realised that life has unexpected turns which can be overcome with the right attitude. We all left that day with a positive mindset and a new outlook towards our blessed lives.

The students explored the gardens and gathered images in the form of drawings and photographs to be used in their printmaking unit of work. It is essential for elective Visual Arts students to gain exposure to a wide variety of artworks, artists, exhibitions and galleries in order to enhance their understanding of the complexities of the art world. This term, Year 11 Visual Arts students have visited the White Rabbit Gallery in Chippendale to view the Vile Bodies exhibition. The White Rabbit Gallery is an art museum, which exhibits 21st century Chinese contemporary art. They will also be visiting the Museum of Contemporary Art at Circular Quay to experience the work of Tatsuo Miyaiima who is one of Japan's most renowned contemporary artists, known for his sculptures and room-scale installations incorporating light and numbers. Connect With Everything is Miyaiima's first exhibition in the Southern Hemisphere. It encompasses his sculptural works, rooms and environments, and performance videos.

The Year 10 elective art students were involved in a community art project with Selma Fida, a ceramic artist who works from a studio at The Clayhouse at the Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre. Selma visited the school during art lessons and the students collaborated with Selma to create a series of six ceramic totem poles based on the theme of future dreams and goals. The completed work has been installed (thanks to Mr Sinden) and looks great nestled amongst the azaleas and bromeliads under the shade of Jenny's Tree in Tumbalong.
