PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents,

School Development Day



At our Term 2 **School Development Day** on Monday 24 April, teachers updated their skills in the very hands-on Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Anaphylaxis training

conducted by Surf Life Saving Australia. Teachers have also completed mandatory Anaphylaxis e-learning modules developed by the Department of Education.

The School Development Day also provided an opportunity for staff to engage with new stage 6 syllabuses planned for implementation in Year 11 in 2018. English, Mathematics, Science and History faculties are now in the process of developing teaching and learning programs which best meet the needs of our students.

Tell Them from Me Survey Findings

Thank you to all students who provided honest and thoughtful responses to the Tell Them from Me survey. Over 75,000 secondary school students in NSW participated in this survey.

The survey results compared favourably with those of the state. Seventy-six percent of our students indicated that they tried hard to succeed (well above the NSW government norm of 66%). Sixty percent of our students indicated that they are intellectually engaged and find learning enjoyable and relevant, significantly higher than the result for the government norm of 46%.

Our strong ethos of learning, high expectations and belief that our students can learn and succeed was affirmed through the survey. Sixty-six percent of students indicated that our school has clear rules and expectations for classroom behaviour that are understood by students and maintained by staff compared to 56% of students in NSW schools. Seventy-eight percent of our students noted that the school held high expectations for all students to succeed, well above the NSW government norm of 70%.

In addition, the data demonstrated that our students are intellectually engaged, value schooling outcomes and believe that what they are learning at school is directly related to their long-term success.

It is very pleasing to note that students have embraced the aspirational culture of our school:

93% of students wanted to finish high school compared to 85% percent of students across the state and 83% of students indicated that they planned to go to university, well above the NSW government norm of 67%.

Data from surveys such as the Tell Them from Me survey provides us with valuable information for school planning. This data will be used to develop programs and processes for improved student engagement and wellbeing. I encourage parents to share their views with us by participating in the Tell Them from Me parent survey next term.

Academic Reports

Term 2 is the reporting term. Teachers are now in the process of writing reports for Year 12 following their mid-course examinations at the end of last term. Year 12 reports should be distributed at the end of Week 4; Year 11 students should receive their reports at the end of Week 6.

Reports will be distributed to students in Years 7-10 during Weeks 8 and 9 in preparation for parent-teacher interviews on Tuesday 27 June. Reports include comments from teachers which indicate strengths and areas for improvement. Students should read their reports carefully and heed their teachers' advice to help overcome any issues experienced with their school work. It is also important to reflect upon the 'Application to Learning' section of the report. It indicates the extent to which a student works to the best of her ability and applies herself to the demands of her subjects. All students should be achieving 'always' in this section.

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I encourage all parents to consider their daughter's report carefully, discuss teachers' comments with their daughter and acknowledge and praise excellent achievement and offer encouragement for improvement.

Please remember that additional support for students is provided through the homework centre which is open Monday – Thursday from 2:50pm-4:45pm.

Study Centre - Liverpool Library

Volunteers from the University of Sydney are providing assistance to students from Years 7-12 through their volunteer tutoring program. The program operates at Liverpool Library on Mondays from 4:00-5:30pm during two block periods: 8 May - 9 June and 7 August - 22 September. All tutors have Working with Children Checks and are trained in safeguarding children.

I encourage students to access this valuable community service if they are not already utilising our own homework centre.

Uniform Matters

Our school community has very high expectations with regard to uniform because students wearing neat and tidy uniform present a very positive message about the school.

School jumpers and blazers, available from our uniform supplier, Berelle School Wear at Regents Park, are an important part of our uniform now that the weather is turning cool.

Cardigans, jackets, hoodies, short sleeved school shirts with long sleeved undergarments or T-shirts of any colour are not part of our uniform and are unacceptable.

Please ensure that your daughter conforms fully to the school's uniform policy, a copy of which can be found in her school diary or on our website, and wears her uniform with pride.

Watch out....Students about

The safety of our students is of paramount concern to us all; however, reckless and bad driving at the front of the school continues to put our students at risk.

Parents please take care to follow the rules of the road when dropping off and picking up your child and ensure the safety of all our students.

Remember that the car parks on the school grounds are for teachers only.

REPORT FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPALS

Congratulations to the 192 students who have a 100% attendance record for Term 1. Well done. A great way to maximise your opportunity to learn!

Year 12 completed their half yearly exams during the last two weeks of Term 1. Marked papers are already being returned to students and teachers will use information from the marking process to adjust teaching programs to ensure our students reach their full potential by the time the HSC starts in October. Students should review their papers to identify areas of strength and areas where they need to build on their knowledge, understanding and skill.

Year 11 students have just completed their mid-course examinations and should be reflecting on the feedback provided by their teachers. Teacher feedback is the greatest resource students can access and use to make the necessary changes that will enhance their personal educational growth. We encourage all senior students to make use of the teacher support/tuition offered in the library Monday to Thursday from 2:50pm – 4:45pm every week.

The majority of **Year 10** students are applying the necessary work ethic in classes and at home to help them achieve successful results in their RoSA year. We have a busy term ahead for

Year 10. The Commerce Mother's Day Stall will be held on Friday 12 May, half yearly exams are scheduled during Week 4 starting Monday 15 May and work experience follows in Week 5 starting Monday 22 May. There are excursions and incursions planned for the Year 10 STEM Team with UTS, the ASPIRE Team with UNSW and for Visual Arts elective students. The term will finish with many Year 10 students performing in the school's Dance display on Thursday 29 June.

Term 2 is a time for all **Year 9** students to really engage in their learning now that they understand what is required of them in all courses especially in their electives. Student application and progress will be recorded formally on the half yearly school reports. NAPLAN will take place during Week 3 this term. Students have been provided with information about the minimum literacy and numeracy standards for the HSC from 2020. Students are able to demonstrate those minimum standards by achieving Band 8 in NAPLAN this year. Additional opportunities will be provided during Years 10, 11 and 12.

Most of our **Year 8** students have settled back into the routine of high school life with many already receiving achievement awards from their teachers. It is good to see so many Year 8 students taking advantage of the school's homework centre which operates for two hours after school on Monday to Thursday. The homework centre provides an excellent opportunity for students to engage productively in their learning. Experienced teachers provide assistance to students who require support with their homework, assignments and assessment tasks. Year 8 students will be engaging in a Maths/Geography excursion towards the end of this term as well as a VA incursion.

Year 7 students have well and truly settled into the swing of 'life at Birrong GHS'. Many students have already been working hard and receiving achievement awards from teachers. When a student submits five achievement awards to a deputy principal she will be awarded a Certificate of Merit. All students are encouraged to be active participants in the *School Merit System* process. An outline of the School Merit System can be found in the school diary. Year 7 students have the Science Reptile incursion to look forward to on Friday 9 June. It is a very slippery, scaly and hands on experience so come prepared. NAPLAN will take place during Week 3 this term.

The school athletics carnival is scheduled for Week 6, Wednesday 31 May, and there is an expectation that all students will be in attendance. The carnival day is a great opportunity for all students to get involved in the fun activities offered on the day. Join the fun by signing up to run a race, jump long or high or throw a javelin, disc or shot put.

HEAD TEACHER ADMINISTRATION REPORT

The text messaging system is a very valuable tool in tracking student attendance. If your daughter has been late to or absent from school, you would have received a text message from the school that asks you for a reply text. It is very important that you make contact with the school at your earliest convenience via text reply or phone call so your daughter's school records can be updated to justify her absence.

The effectiveness of the text messaging system in ensuring the safety of your daughter relies on you responding to the text by explaining the nature of your daughter's absence, her name and roll call class.

If you have any concerns about the text message system please contact the school.

Over the year many families have changed their personal and contact details because they have moved house, changed telephone companies or obtained a new mobile phone number. It is very important that you inform the school immediately of any changes you make. There have been several incidents at school where the school has needed to contact parents in an emergency and have not had the most up to date contact numbers.

If you change your mobile phone details it is very important that you inform the school immediately.

Early Leaver Passes – Parents who wish their daughters to leave school early for medical appointments must provide a written note including contact details, for their daughter to bring to school. This note must be presented to the Head Teacher Administration **before 8:20am** on the day the student needs to leave early. Parents will be sent a SMS when their daughters apply for an early leavers pass. After this time, parents will be required to come to the school and sign their daughters out at the front office.

Parent/Teacher Interviews

Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who attended Parent/Teacher interviews on Tuesday 14 March. Over 200 parents attended which helped to make the Parent/Teacher session a great success.

Please note that the next Parent/Teacher session will be on Tuesday 27 June (the last Tuesday of Term 2) from 2pm to 6pm. We will be changing the way in which appointments with teachers will be made for this event. In the past, students were given a booking sheet and were asked to make appointments on behalf of their parents. For the next Parent/Teacher session, **parents will be asked to make their bookings** for appointments online over the internet using a

website called 'School Interviews' (<https://www.schoolinterviews.com.au/>).

Appointments can be made on any device that has internet access. To access this website parents need an email address and an event code which will be sent out to all parents and caregivers closer to the event. Feel free to work with your daughter to book interviews. You can use your daughter's email address if you don't have one. More details and instructions will be given to parents/caregivers as we draw closer to 27 June. If you have any concerns or questions, please feel free to contact me.

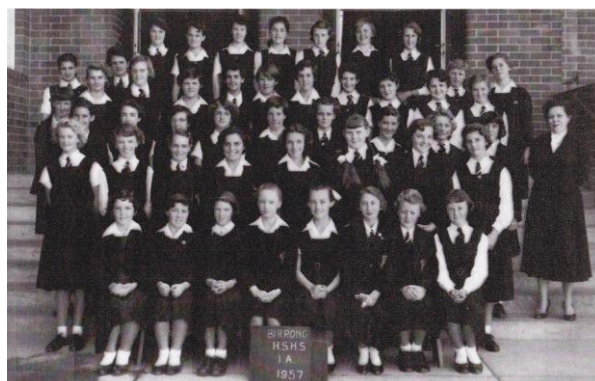
WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

School holidays

The School Student Transport Scheme does not cover travel during school holidays or on weekends.

In Opal areas, students may see "reason codes" on Opal card readers if they use their School Opal card during these times. Please see the table below for reason code explanations.

Opal code	Reason
Card not valid X 65	The card is not approved for this service
Card not valid X 70	The card is not valid for this date, e.g. is being used outside school term
Card not valid X 72	The card is not valid for the current day type, e.g. is being used on weekends

For travel on weekends and school holidays, students must travel with a Child/Youth Opal card, Child/Youth Opal single trip ticket, Child/Youth Opal single bus ticket or child paper ticket.

2. **Cash and cheque payments:** Between **19 July 2017 and 24 July 2017**, we will also not be able to accept payments by cash or cheque as we prepare to close our current bank account and transition to the new one. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding cash or cheque payments before **19 July 2017**. From **25 July 2017**, cash and cheque payments will be accepted as before.

NOTIFICATION TO SCHOOL IMMUNISATION CO-ORDINATORS NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health, in partnership with schools offers vaccines recommended for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC).

In 2017, the following vaccines will be offered:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2-doses in 2017 at least 6 months apart*
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
	Varicella vaccine (chickenpox) – catch-up	Single dose
Years 11-12	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

** The second dose of HPV vaccine is being delayed to later in the year (at least 6 months after the first dose) and the recently announced Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination Program is to be offered to students in Years 11 and 12 from Term 2 when the second dose of HPV vaccine is usually given. There is no evidence of harm or compromised immunity or protection from delaying the second dose of the HPV vaccine. Further advice will be provided to parents/guardians later in the year regarding the remaining HPV dose/s.*

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Please note that students who commence HPV vaccination in school clinics in Year 7 but do not complete the course during the school year may be offered catch-up doses at school in Year 8. Students who have any HPV doses at their GP will be advised to complete the course with their GP.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form (within 1 business day). Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.
